

TYLE GUIDE

- 1. Entries must consist of max. 5,000 words in English (does not include the title and sources). They should have a maximum of 3-5 exhibits or tables.
- 2. Style and language should be targeted at a broad readership, avoiding unnecessary technicalities and jargon.
- 3. Entries should begin with a title page containing: the title of the essay, date of submission, word count, main contact author's name, address, phone number/email address, date of birth, list of further authors.
- 4. Entries should include an abstract of about 200-300 words on page 1
- 5. Entries should be in 12-point Times New Roman or an equivalent font with a one-inch margin on all sides of the page, double-spaced, using A4-sized paper.
- 6. Entries should be page numbered starting with page 1 of the essay, but not the title page; every subsequent page should carry the title and a page number, but NOT the author's name (to facilitate blind judging).
- 7. Entries must be attached as a PDF or Word document when submitted.
- 8. Any quotations or copyrighted material used must be identified properly.
- 9. References in footnote and in bibliography at the end preferred, in the following format, e.g.: Abe, Shinzo, "Unleashing the power of 'womenomics,'" The Wall Street Journal, September 25, 2013.
